# What to look for in a Training Provider

What follows is a guide rather than an exhaustive list of questions. You may not get everything from your Training Provider, so approach this list diplomatically and trust your instincts.

#### **Financial**

- How much does the course cost?
- Are fees taken upfront or at set intervals?
- Can you pay in instalments?
- If you're unhappy with the course, what is the refund policy?
- Does your fee cover Resuscitation Training and OSCE (practical exam) training? [note: these are both essential in order to pass the National Diploma]
- What happens if you cannot find employment? [note: you cannot complete the National
  Diploma without practical experience working in a dental practice]

### Teaching outside the curriculum

#### Will your Provider supply:

- Additional no-cost training? For example, in the past, FDE has provided additional teaching modules to reflect the latest technical innovations; e.g. minimal intervention dentistry, digital dentistry
- Outside speakers? FDE includes guest speakers as part of its teaching programme; e.g. dental specialists, hygienist-therapists, sedationists.
- External visits? FDE has taken students to visit the Royal College of Surgeons, Dental Laboratories, and Anatomy Exhibitions.
- Associated skill training? FDE teaches all-round dental practice skills such as dental reception and practice management.

## **Interactive teaching**

### Does your Provider supply:

- Hands-on teaching on practical aspects of dentistry?
- Teaching in a clinical environment?

# **Support and mentorship**

### Will there be:

• **Personal support?** In the past, FDE has helped candidates with health issues or family commitments which could otherwise have prevented them from completing the course.

### Miscellaneous

- How many years of teaching experience does your teaching team possess?
- Does anyone in the team have any post-graduate qualifications?
- What is the provider's pass rate?
- What career path have students taken post-qualification?
